- The vessel must be used as a means of transport by the traveler who has imported it into Seychelles.
- The vessel must not be used by any other person, in particular by a person who is a resident in Seychelles.
- The vessel must not be used for transportation of goods and people for remuneration, or for any other industrial or commercial purposes.
- The vessel must not be lent, sold, hired, given away, exchange or otherwise disposed of in Seychelles
- The vessel must be exported before the expiring period of the temporary admission
- Upon the expiring period of the temporary admission the person responsible for the pleasure yacht must apply for approval if she/ he wants to extend the period of stay in Seychelles.
- The vessel must submit an export bill of entry upon departure.

It is important to note that it is an offence under the Customs Management Act:

•not to make entries or declaration

- •to make or deliver to Customs a false document
- to defraud Customs of any duties, taxes or levies

Temporary Admission of Pleasure Yachts



An explanation about Temporary Admission of Pleasure Yachts

SEYCHELLES

What is Temporary Admission ?

Temporary Admission is a Customs procedure under which certain goods are imported for a specific purpose and can benefit from total or partial relief from the payment of Import duties and taxes.

In that case, a traveler/visitor who resides outside Seychelles is allowed to bring pleasure yachts as a means of transport. Visiting yachts entering Seychelles temporarily for personal use may enter the country without payment of import duty and Value Added Tax upon the approval of Customs.

Pleasure yachts are vessels used for pleasure and recreation purposes only

What is the period allowed for temporary admission of pleasure yachts?

The Commissioner of Customs may determine the period for temporary admission which must not exceed 12 months .

What is the requirement to report?

Once the visiting yachts enter Seychelles, Customs Boarding Officers will board and issue a clearance certificate to the yacht. Customs Boarding Officers will provide the yacht with the necessary instruction. The yachts have one month to submit a Customs declaration.

How to report?

For administrative purposes, Customs will issue an initial 1 month period without having to submit a Customs declaration. Prior to the lapse of the one month period, to extend its stay in Seychelles, the person responsible for the Yacht is required to contact:

The person responsible for the pleasure yacht must fill the Temporary Admission form requesting the period of stay for the pleasure yacht in Seychelles.

What documents are required to be submitted with the temporary Admission form?

The following documents must be submitted with the form:

- Certificate of registration of the vessel or a valid sale agreement
- Certificate of registration of the company and certificate of directors and shareholders (if applicable)
- Valid Insurance document of the vessel
- Bill of sales
- Builder's certificate.
- Copy of passport
- Picture of vessel
- Import Permit

What is the procedure to follow upon Customs approval?

Upon Customs approval the person responsible for the pleasure yacht must submit to Customs a Bill of Entry using IM5.

What is the requirement to qualify for Temporary Admission without payment of taxes?

To qualify for Temporary Admission without payment of taxes the traveler/visitor must prove to Customs that :

- The vessel is registered outside Seychelles
- The owner of the vessel must be a person who is living or has established abroad.
- The traveler/visitor is the owner of the vessel or has been authorized by the owner to use the vessel
- While in Seychelles the vessel will be for private used only.

What are the conditions for Temporary Admission ?

There are specific conditions attached to the Temporary Admission of pleasure yacht?

- The person responsible for the pleasure yacht must submit appropriate Customs declaration of the vessel
- The vessel must be used solely for private use
